

Political and Economic Update 2020



Guyana held elections in March 2020. Five months later, we have a new President. The prolonged political impasse, combined with the COVID-19 pandemic, in which Guyana has recorded 568 cases and 22 deaths, certainly has implications on the country's economy.

Guyana's economy is expected to grow by 52.8 percent, down from the 85.6 percent growth projected for 2020 in International Monetary Fund forecasts. The revised downward trend is a result of falling oil prices and the COVID-19 pandemic. The growth will be driven by an expansion in the oil and gas (O&G) sector, while COVID-19 is expected to have a negative impact on all other economic sectors within the country. Guyana is one of the few countries globally for which positive economic growth is forecasted in 2020. However, it should be emphasized that this is as a result of a new O&G industry coupled with an increase in the price of gold, which is Guyana's second largest export.

Over the last quarter, the Centre has shifted to 100 percent virtual services, seminars and courses. The Centre has continued to offer businesses one-on-one consulting through phone, video conference and WhatsApp. COVID-19 forced the Centre to adapt and forge a pathway for Guyanese businesses to follow. The seminars on Offshore Oil and Gas, Procurement for Local Suppliers as well as the Computer Based Seminar have attracted over 300 people in the last guarter.

Dr. Foreman's webinar explained the recent drop in global oil prices and what this means to Guyana's reserves. HSSE Updates



COVID-19 highlights that health, safety, security and environment (HSSE) work is not only for the oil and gas industry. Over the last 3 months, PPE and N95 masks are important topics for all businesses. The Centre's commitment to HSSE training did not wane but went virtual as well. As companies prepare to bounce back post COVID closedowns, multiple firms progressed through the Centre's HSSE programme. This work was supported through virtual courses in Workplace Assessment, Job Safety Analysis and Hazard Identification.

In addition, Centre staff are consulting with firms via phone, teleconference and WhatsApp. These consultations allow firms to gain critical feedback for their HSSE plans. During the last three months, at least nine firms are in the final stage: awaiting a Centre site visit of their workspace to confirm HSSE plans. Beyond the HSSE programme, the Centre launched a twice-weekly Tool Box talk. These five to 15 minute teleconferences allow the Centre to pass along key HSSE information in an easy-to-digest format to businesses. It allows the development of that critical safety culture to continue even when employees are not on-site.
